Father Christmas is visiting his special, cosy Gawcott Grotto and is meeting a few of our local children and their families. The gardens will be decorated with lights and a giant Christmas tree, there will be a magical walk through the woods to try and

find the home of 'Gawky the Gawcott Elf' as well as other crafts for our 'paying guests' to join in. These children will also receive a gift from Father Christmas, so early booking and payment is advised as the elves need to go shopping! Even if you are not booking to visit Father Christmas, you are still very welcome to walk through the garden and woods and have a seat in our 'Christmas Café' and enjoy a hot drink and a warm mince pie (donations to Alec's Angels).

We joined with our lovely neighbours to make a small display next to the Wishing Well in honour of Remembrance Day. The soldier, beautifully made by Lyall, will be appearing again next November. Samantha again crocheted poppies, 500 in total, which were distributed for donations from the stall outside Tesco.
